- 1 On 2nd Street NW, paralleling the greenway, between Gilmer and Patton. Kingfishers patrol the creek in the stone-lined channel. The best birding in this section begins at Walker Avenue (at the back entrance/exit to the civic center) in the trees across the creek from the trail, on to Orange Avenue. Barred owls and Cooper's and sharp-shinned hawks have been seen in the trees near the highway.
- On Carver Avenue NW, off Burrell Street near the Booker T. Washington Park pool. Check the stand of pin oaks near the small picnic shelter for flickers, flycatchers and bluebirds. Look for killdeer on the baseball field in the lower part of the park.
- 3 On Carver Avenue NW, off Orange Avenue behind Addison Middle School. This is the closest parking to the best birding places in this stretch of the greenway, in the woods behind Addison School and on along the trail into the woods and along the creek to the beginning of Brown-Robertson Park. Redstarts and warblers including chestnut-sided, yellowrumped, black-throated green, prairie, palm, and black-and-white have been seen here.
- 4 On 10th Street NW near the Lick Run Greenway and Brown-Robertson Park signs, across from the Pure gas station. Scan the sky for raptors and gulls. Carolina wrens let you know they are around.
- 5 On Andrews Road NW where the greenway crosses the road. There is a small cattail marsh a short distance from this parking place (toward Valley View Mall) where yellowthroats have been seen.
- 6 At the Valley View Mall lot in front of Best Buy where the Lick Run Greenway trail begins/ends. As soon as the trail crosses I-581 and drops down close to the creek, there is a pool in the creek where mallards have been seen.
