

High Altitude (includes Sunset Field and old Air Force Station road down FR 812 to about 1 mile east of Parker's Gap)

1. Chestnut-sided Warbler (1)

2. Black-and-white Warbler (1)

Other birds of interest to be looked for on this section of the road include Turkey, Ruffed Grouse, Barred Owl, Black-billed Cuckoo, Veery, and Rose-breasted Grosbeak.

Mid-Altitude (includes FR 812 from about 1 mile east of Parker's Gap, down to Parker's Gap and FR 768 to North Creek Road; be sure to check recent roads leading to clear-cuts)

As you proceed down FR 812, look for the newly emerging catkins on oaks. These will be the best spots to search for migrant warbler waves. The following migrants have been spotted on Warbler Road.
